THE MOST BASIC OF NEEDS

Clean water not only saves lives through the provision of safe drinking water, but also has a much wider impact including sanitation, growing food and sustaining livestock.

Water is a luxury for the people of Western Kenya - especially running water. Most people walk to wells to collect water on a daily basis. Some having to walk up to three kilometres to the nearest well.



90% of medicines are bought by individuals rather than the state. It would cost a low-skilled government employee in Kenya an entire months wage for a course of antibiotics to treat pneumonia. Livestock, along with possessions and family treasures, are sold until there is nothing left, in the hope of keeping a breadwinner alive.

Medical camps previously run by Angel Welfare have been very successful. They are open to everyone, Muslims and non-Muslims. There are usually one or two doctors and a few nurses helping. The camp is mobile and travels across western Kenya.

Diseases treated: malaria, ringworm, thread worm, oral thrush, vaginal trush, cystitis, respiratory disease and scabies.

Medical Camps – Started December 2nd 2013 for 38 working days. We ran 2 medical camps simultaneously at 2 different location. The camps did 76 stations in total and treated over 16,000 patients. Treated most patients at the camp, others were sign posted to medical or hospital clinics. Nearly one third of patients had Malaria.

Jiggers are causing misery for millions of Kenyans. The tiny parasitic sand flies thrive in poor hygiene, and breed in the human body which can cause deformities and even death. Through our jiggers programme we have treated 5,000 patients over a period of two months.

MEDICAL CAMP COST: £7,500 per month

We support many orphans in dire conditions, living with single guardians e.g. grandparents, uncles and aunts. We decided the best way to help these poor orphans was to sponsor them where they are living rather than build an orphanage. The reason behind this being the need to keep the children within their own family and environment.

With the daily challenges posed by economic difficulty and other threats a good education comes with a price and it is often a price that many people in Third World countries are not able to pay. After the basic needs such as food, clothing and shelter are met, only then can the parents really focus on their children's schooling.

When born into this world, the future of each child is a blank canvas - in terms of intellectual capability or imagination there is no discrepancy between a First and a Third World child. It is the environment and opportunities available to them that then begin to mark and shape that canvas and determine the life path of each child. Will they get an education? Will they be fed, housed, healthy and looked after? Opportunity, education and environment become barriers. What's to say that given an education and the opportunity these children couldn't be scholars, teachers or the doctors of tomorrow?

It is very difficult for widows to financially support themselves, and through the provision of food and basic needs throughout the year we can bring comfort to their lives.

A masjid is the heart of the community, allowing not only a central place for worship for the daily prayers, but also providing a medium for educational, development and community activities. It is an excellent form of Sadagah Jariyah.

Each mosque is built to the following standards:

Approximately a 700 Sq ft covered area – comprising of:

- 1 x main male prayer area
- 1 x women prayer area
- 1 x toilet facilities
- 1 x ablution place
- 1 x well or water pump
- 1 x imaam house

Kakamega is a small town approximately 100 km west of Kisumu and Lake Victoria. Kakamega is a regional hub for agricultural and livestock trade. Many muslims that attend the Jamia mosque are either labourers, farmers or owners of small businesses. The Jamia Mosque is located in the centre of Kakamega and is a landmark for all the locals. The Mosque also houses a madressa for 500 children and a nursery for 100 children up to 5 years old.

Even though there has been a mosque here for over 75 years, the present mosque was built 25 years ago and has been extended and renovated a few times. The growing population and the demand from local Muslims for a Central Mosque for multiple purposes such as sermons, gatherings, Eid Salaah etc. qualifies this mosque to be rebuilt to meet the present Muslim needs. Angel Welfare & Education Trust sponsor the 2 Imaams at this mosque and run quite a few projects here such as food distribution, artisans program, etc.

The largest project and by far the most popular project is cooked Iftaar during Ramadan. Every Iftaar in Ramadan a cooked meal is prepared for over 500 persons to partake in. We have been told since the AWET Iftaar program has begun in 2009 there has been an approximate 25% increase in attendees.

JAMIA MOSQUE KAKAMEGA APPEAL:



Proposal

The proposed plan is to build a Mosque for 1000 musallees inshaAllah. In addition, there will be a wudhu area for 50 persons and a toilet block for 25 persons. A separate Ladies and small childrens entrance and a Madressa capacity of 600 children.

The need for this Mosque cannot be overstated and inshaAllah the guidance and prayers from this Mosque as a Markaz for the Kakamega district and beyond is limitless.





Education Centre

The purpose of this centre is mainly for learning and teaching Deen to new and old Muslims. New Muslims can learn Deen and go back to their villages and the old can polish up on their knowledge. Other activities would be gatherings for regional discussions for Imams, and talks on Deen to Muslims. This site was chosen for the Daawah centre because it is on a large plot of land, approximately 15 acres and not far from Kakamega.





School Meals & Education



Reality for our children is but a dream for school children in western Kenya. The ill fitting uniforms is just something we can see but for most school children breakfast and lunch is non-existent. One meal a day at home usually consisting of only maize and some sugar cane is the staple diet of the Kenyan youth. Vegetables and protein is not part of the main diet and is not seen in the villages of western Kenya.

Angel welfare & education trust have chosen 3 schools to provide porridge for all the 1200 students on every school day for the full year. The response in class and in their educational progress has been dramatic. The cost is 5 pence per child per day.

The need to provide more nourishment for these children is plain to see especially with the average age in western Kenya being only 55 years.

Imams Wages

The Imams mostly reside in a property specially built next to the Masjid for them Most do not have another job because of their duties to the Masjid and Madrassah. They survive on what the local Muslims have to offer them, who are largely poor and destitute themselves. £30 per month is not too much to ask for looking after a whole community and their Masjid. Sow the seeds of Islam today and Insha-Allah be rewarded until the Day of Judgement.


