ANGEL WELFARE & EDUCATION CEO STATEMENT 2018

During 2017 Angel Welfare & Education Trust (AWET) had mixed fortunes, on the one hand we **delivered** £1 Million worth of aid and on the other our co-founder and colleague Dr Qudratulla Khan (May the mercy of Allah be upon him) passed away.

Dr Khan kept busy seeking the pleasure of Allah. Whether he was calling people to the Masjid, dealing with Preston Muslim Girls High School or working as a GP his sole aim was only to seek the pleasure of Allah. At AWET Dr Khan played an active role in guiding and directing the charitable projects. Dr Khan was key to fashioning AWET into a charity that would protect the weak, educate the young and facilitate the needs of Western Kenya. During this process AWET would protect donors and recipients whilst staying on the main objective to keep people on their Imaan.

For AWET **the largest Food Distribution to date took place** by increasing the amount of food and the number of recipients (circa 17,000) **at a total cost of over £400,000**. We intend to repeat this food distribution during 2018. Other projects which include widows houses, widows farming, orphan sponsor, clothes distribution, medical camps, Qurbani, school feeding, weddings, ladies programmes amongst others have grown by 10-30% from the previous year in general.

Almost all of the **54 Water wells completed** in 2017 were provided in the Mbale district of Uganda, which borders Western Kenya. There is a shortage of water due to the indifferent weather in the region coupled with the difficulty of installing wells. Although we have a small backlog of wells to complete we shall continue to provide more well facilities by increasing the number of teams we have on the ground.

AWET has been blessed with a large core of volunteers who aid in project delivery as well as fundraising with whose assistance we have managed to function with such ease. **We would like to thank all donors and volunteers for their help, assistance and prayers.**

Our most important, yet most underfunded project, is designed to enable our brothers and sisters to prosper in this life and the hereafter. The Education Centre has been established to teach Muslims about Islam, many of who are new to the religion. A variety of programmes are delivered, catering for everyone including orphans, the youth and Imaams. These teachings are then spread back home in their villages to allow Islam to grow and flourish. The centre is also used as a regional meeting point for Imaams.

The average daily meal for a Kenyan child is usually one meal consisting of maize and sugar cane. Even basic vegetables and protein are not part of the staple diet. For most children, breakfast and lunch is non-existent. How can we expect children to concentrate and learn under such conditions?

AWET provides porridge for 1200 Students across 8 schools on a daily basis throughout the school year. A regular standing order will provide nourishment for multiple children every day.

The widows of Kenya are also our mothers. Having lost their husbands, they struggle to come by the very basic necessities to survive. AWET regularly distributes food packages to over 800 widows. Where possible AWET also supports self-sufficiency by providing seed and fertiliser to enable the widows to cultivate their family land. This allows them to grow their own crops to feed themselves and also generate a household income.



Water is an essential part of life many of us take for granted. A lack of access to clean water can lead to dehydration, severe infection and blindness. One of the main aims of AWET is to help individuals support themselves. One way we do this is to provide start up costs for businesses and self-sufficiency projects. The individual who receives the fund will be the sole owner of the business and keep all profits generated.

The Imaam has an essential role of facilitating the needs of the locality. As well as leading the five times daily salaah they are involved in teaching children and supporting the elderly and widows.

Nikah (marriage) is a practice of all the Prophets A.S. It constitutes half of a Believer's faith and provides stability in the lives of human beings. It is this stability on a personal level that can provide an individual to be the best they can be in all aspects of life and provide stability for the fabric of society.

We were able to provide for the weddings of and sponsor 50 couples in 2017. Insha-Allah with your Duas and contributions we aim to increase that number for 2018.

A natural self-sustenance project which has worked well for many farmers. We provide seed and fertiliser for Farmers at a cost of £75 which generates annual income ranging between £400 and £1,000.

In Western Kenya the need for lavatories is very apparent. We have seen schools with over 500 children sharing just two lavatories. Having to wait in long queues inevitably leads to education being compromised.

We live in a world of convenience where the next travel stop will always have decent arrangements for relief. In the rural areas of Kenya it is either a queue for a lavatory or a bush, even at school, market areas or other places where we expect facilities to be sufficient.

Lavatories are built in blocks of two with a lifespan of approximately 15-20 years. The foundation and walls are made of concrete and plaster, and the roof is of tin sheets. The hygiene tank which serves both lavatories is non-reversible which lasts for 15-20 years. The tank

is designed to eliminate odours utilising chemicals and maskers which neutralise foul odours. The non-reversible entry system aids hygiene by preventing incidents or accidents.

In a land where water and food is a concern medical needs are neglected leading to deteriorating situation of illness and lack of income. Malaria is still the largest killer in Kenya. Jigger infestation is another misery for many Kenyans.

Our medical camp runs for a month treating over 5,000 men, women and children. Facilitated by doctors, nurses and pharmacists.

Masjid is the heart of the community, allowing not only a central place for worship for the daily prayers, but also providing a medium for educational, development and community activities. It is an excellent form of Sadaqah Jariyah.

- 1 Main Male Prayer Area
- 1 Women Prayer Area / Madressa
- 1 Toilet Facilities
- 1 Ablution Facility
- 1 Well or Water Tank
- 1 Imaam House
