AWET CEO Report 2019

In 2018 Angel welfare & education trust (AWET) utilised nearly £900,000 on welfare and educational aid in Western Kenya. The positive results and positive feedback from beneficiaries we experienced in the region are extremely encouraging.

Many of our projects are continuous projects and require attention and reporting throughout the year. For example school feeding, orphan support and educational training seminars. AWET is working with local organisations to provide awareness of health and social responsibility. The continuing projects require financial management, which means we release funds monthly or quarterly spreading the payment over the year.

Each activity or project undertaken by AWET has specific benefits for the individuals and the community in general. The financial benefit is always obvious but the mental and social benefits (also known as public benefit) are difficult to quantify and report.

Education seminars is a perfect way for us to identify local needs whilst providing awareness on health and social matters. Providing lavatories and clean water helps keep the children and adults healthy and away from diseases and illnesses. A healthier population provides the platform for children to attend schools and adults to go out to work. Maize is still the number one staple food item in Kenya and the number one crop grown by Kenyan farmers. Our farming projects which aid over 300 farmers to farm their family land provides much wanted food and of paramount value the uplift in self-esteem and self-respect.

Providing food, clothing and shelter are basics of human need and we shall carry on providing these necessities to the most vulnerable. We provide these in the form of food distribution, uniforms for schools and housing for widowed families with little or no family support. Other community projects are undertaken such as wedding ceremonies, school meals and business start-up as well as primary, secondary and tertiary scholarships. These AWET community projects are to provide a foundation for the youth to excel in their aspirations to professions and vocations, which normally would be beyond their reach simply due to absolute poverty.

In 2019 AWET aims to add projects to aid orphans and widows and general needy persons in Nairobi, Mombasa and Lamu areas as well as maintaining activities in western Kenya. Expanding our aid and expertise to a wider geography shall help us to capture more of the persons who require assistance and aid.

Further challenges lie ahead whilst we grow our fundraising and the area of our charitable activities. AWET would like to applaud and thank our volunteers, ambassadors and partners for their relentless efforts and no complaint attitude with which they have aided and supported the needy and unfortunate thus far. With the aid of our volunteers and ambassadors we shall remain focused on our growth and provide a firm ground for more families to rise above the poverty threshold via our welfare and education activities.

AWET provides porridge for 2473 Students across 8 schools on a daily basis throughout the school year. A regular standing order will provide nourishment for multiple children every day.




A variety of programmes are delivered, catering for everyone including orphans, the youth and Imaams.

The widows of Kenya are also our mothers. Having lost their husbands, they struggle to come by the very basic necessities to survive. AWET regularly distributes food packages to over 1,000 widows. Where possible AWET also supports self-sufficiency by providing seed and fertiliser to enable the widows to cultivate their family land. This allows them to grow their own crops to feed themselves and also generate a household income.

In Western Kenya the need for lavatories is very apparent.

In Western Kenya the need for lavatories is very apparent. We have seen schools with over 500 children sharing just two lavatories. Having to wait in long queues inevitably leads to education being compromised.

We live in a world of convenience where the next travel stop will always have decent arrangements for relief. In the rural areas of Kenya it is either a queue

for a lavatory or a bush, even at school, market areas or other places where we expect facilities to be sufficient.

Lavatories are built in blocks of two with a lifespan of approximately 15-20 years. The foundation and walls are made of concrete and plaster, and the roof is of tin sheets. The hygiene tank which serves both lavatories is non-reversible which lasts for 15-20 years. The tank is designed to eliminate odours utilising chemicals and

maskers which neutralise foul odours. The non-reversible entry system aids hygiene by preventing incidents or accidents.



Helping individuals support themselves.

One of the main aims of AWET is to help individuals support themselves. One way we do this is to provide start up costs for businesses and self-sufficiency projects. The individual who receives the fund will be the sole owner of the business and keep all profits generated.
